

KCCRT Mission

KCCRT supports first responders and communities by deploying trained peer support teams to assist with critical incident stress management (CISM) after traumatic events. CISM includes debriefings after the event, information sessions, and one-to-one interventions with peers.

KCCRT Serves

- Emergency service personnel after a critical incident such as line of duty death, incidents involving children, suicide, structure fire fatality, fatality EMS runs, and any other critical incident.
- KCCRT can be requested for community members after a critical incident such as workplace violence, accidents, traumatic incidents or after disasters.

KCCRT Provides

 Peer support strike teams, including chaplains and behavioral health professionals, trained in critical incident stress management and psychological first aid to the field, deployed upon request for services.
